

Our Structure & Governance

- We are a highly sustainable charity. Almost all of our already low running costs are covered by income from property, so nearly every pound we receive in donations can go directly to our investments in disaster relief and wider rural sustainablilty.
- Our Chairman and Board of Trustees are rigorously selected for their professional skills and experience, and serve defined terms of office. In addition to the main board, each Trustee sits on one or more of our three working groups: Housing, Marketing, and Governance and Resourcing. All Trustees work closely with our CEO, and formally report to the Chair of Trustees.
